

### RETROSPECT

arakeswar Degree College is a relatively new college as compared to other colleges in the neighbour hood. It was established thirty five years ago on 5th September-1986, a day celebrated as the Teacher's Day in memory of Dr. Sarbapally Radhakrishnan, a renowned Indian philosopher and educationist. Our Silver Jubilee Year's Celebration was observed through various academic activities and cultural programmes in 2011.

Tarakeswar is situated in the rural hinterland of Hooghly district in West Bengal. It is about 60 Kms away from the city of Kolkata. It is a well known place of pilgrimage for the devotees of Lord Shiva. The place Tarakeswar owes its name to Lord Taraknath, its presiding deity. The extension of the railway track from Sheoraphully to Tarakeswar in the year 1884 facilitated the influx of pilgrims to this place and thereby heightened the popularity of Tarakeswar. It is well-connected by both bus and train with various places of West Bengal.

The Hooghly district, pre-dominantly, has an agro-based economy. The students coming to this college hail from families with agricultural background. There are even first generation learners and it is a challenge to impart knowledge to them.

However, the apparent drawbacks did not deter the visionary forefathers of this Institution from laying its foundation. They worked relentlessly to transform their dream into reality, to enlighten and ignite the minds of a large section of uneducated off-springs of peasant families. The tireless efforts of a group of people who were concerned about the deplorable lack of higher educational at facilities in and around Tarkeswar made it possible to form a preparatory committee with the following members: (1) Sri Sabyasachi Sen. D.M.. Hooghly (President), (2) Late Kenaram Bhowmik (Secretary), (3) Sri Srimat Dandi Swami Hrishikesh Ashram Mohanta Maharaj, Tarakeswar Math, (4) Late Anil Basu, M.P. (5) Late Narandranath Mukherjee, (6) Late Kashinath Ghosh, (7) Late Nityagopal Pal, (8) Late Sadan Chandra Ghosh (9) Late Ramsingh Pal, (10) Sri Tushar Kanti Pal, (11) Sri Partha Banerjee, (12) Late Krishna Ch. Samanta (13) Late Arjun Krishna Bera, (14) Late Bimalendu Mazumder, (15) Sri Ajit Kumar Ghosh, (16) Sri Swapan Kumar Samanta, (17) Sri Tarak Prasad Banerjee, (18) Late Jagannath Kheto, (19) Sri Kartick Ch. Majhi, (20) Late Krishna Mohan Das, (21) Late Biren Dutta, (22) Sm Mira Roy, and (23) Sri Dipak Banerjee.

His Holiness Sri Srimat Dandiswami Hrishikesh Ashram Mahanta Maharaj of Tarakeswar Math with his kindness and generosity donated 3.5 acres of prime land for the purpose of establishing the college campus. Kind support from the Hon'ble Member of Parliament, Sri Anil Basu, and Hon'ble Minister of Fire & Emergency Services Department, Govt, of West Bengal, Late Pratim Chatterjee, Sri Shankar Ray Chowdhury, Ex-General of Army & Member of Rajya Sabha, who made liberal contributions from their Local Area Development Funds, became instrumental in shaping the college. The spontaneous help of the rank and file of Tarakeswar and the surrounding villages, the active co-operation of Tarakeswar Municipality and new mass oriented higher education policy of West Bengal Government combined to bring this centre of learning into existence.

The college never boasts of being a centre of excellence but it has definitely served as a nodal college in this region. In recognition of the above and of its potential to excel as a centre of learning the college was recognised under Section 2F & 12B of the UGC on January 24,1991. Despite several odds, the college has made conspicuous progress in terms of physical expansion, diversification of the subject combinations and number of students getting enrolled.

The college started its journey with six departments (Pass), having only 37 students. Today we have more than 4000 students pursuing both General and Honours curriculam in as many as twenty departments.

# (ADMISSION PROCEDURE)

During last few years the admission of the students in 1st Year BA/B.Sc./B.Com/BBA Honours and General Courses was conducted through college online portal strictly following the university rules and subjectwise college criterion; payments were made through payment getway. The admitted students were visited the college first time on the date specified for induction programme and document verification.

But from this year, the admission of the students to 1st semister courses will be conducted through admission portal centrally controlled by the department of Higher Education, Government of West Bengal. Students should apply collegewise maintaining the terms and conditions of the college; and the remaining procedure of admission will be controlled by the central admission portal.

# (STUDENT SUPPORT SYSTEM)

The college firmly believes that a worthy institution is expected not only to impact education to the students but also to provide them with valuable support for their progression from the college to future education or to the world of job market. The institute also believes that during their studentship in the college adequate scope should be provided for health-aids, entertainment, refreshment, complaint redressal etc.

#### Tarakeswar Degree College Central Library

College library started its work from the very beginning of the College. Despite of other limitations, we are doing our best to satisfy the requirements of our users in the best possible ways. The library system is at present being converted to IT based one with the help of Library Management Software (Cloud Version) designed and developed by KOHA. Whole collection is arranged under Dewey Decimal Classification Scheme (DDC) and arranged in the stack room accordingly. This arrangement helps to retrieve book quickly for the reader which saves the time of user. Keeping in mind the library is a growing organisation, present employees are working for the benefit of the steakholders. Our library has joined in N-LIST programme of INFLIBNET and online member of the British Council Library Our ultimate goal is to provide the right document/information to the right user at the right time with the help of modern technology as well as a human touch. We might have achieved little so far but hope to do more for our honourable users in future. This vision inspires us to work harder and provide the best we can every time to every user of this library in future.

#### \*LIBRARY FACILITIES

The College has a rich and useful Library consisting of more than 24,300 text and reference books of various disciplines. It has a reference section, a lending section and a separate Reading Room. The Library has now the following facilities: (a) Open Access for Books; (b) Open Access for Journals; (c) Open Public Access Catalogue; (d) Display of current journals; (e) display of daily newspapers.

On payment of the library deposit each student is provided with two cards, one Reference card and the other Lending / Borrowing card. The cards are strictly NON TRANSFERABLE. Reference card is meant for the issue of a book to be read, only on the day, in the Reading Room. Books will be issued against Lending / Borrowing card for home use.

#### \*LIBRARY RULES

- Students can borrow two books at a time, which must be returned within 15 days from the date of the issue.
   Books may be re issued, if there is no demand for them.
- Any student keeping a book beyond the time allowed will be fined as decided by the college and even
  debarred from using the library for one week or more depending on the situation.
  - Any book lost, damaged or defaced must be replaced by the borrower. If the book be one of a series and not be available single, the whole set must be replaced. If the book is lost, and is out of print, the borrower must pay a fine to be decided by the college, in addition to the printed price. Until the damaged or lost book is replaced, the borrower will not have the right to use the library.
  - Honours students are allowed to borrow books only for Puja Vacation, which should be returned within one week after the re-opening of the College; thereafter fine will be charged as per rules, including the vacation period. This fine will not be excused on any ground whatsoever.
- Students will be issued books only once in a day on Borrower's Card. Return of the same will not be allowed
  after the lapse of a full day.
- There will be no issue of books for home on Saturday, but books on Reference Card will be available for use in the Reading Room.
- Old students who have graduated from the College and are studying in Post-graduate classes may, on the recommendation of the Librarian and permission of the Principal, avail the Reading Room facility but will not be allowed to borrow books under any circumstances.
- Library cards are to be kept with utmost care, loss of which must be reported immediately to the Librarian
  and a duplicate card will be issued on payment of fine. Cards must be surrendered and clearance certificates
  will have to be obtained before filling up the forms for B.A./B.Com/B.Sc Final Examinations.
- Students seeking Transfer Certificate and the refund of Library deposit must produce a clearance certificate from the Librarian for the purpose, to the college office.
- Late fee for return of Library book beyond one month is @ Rs. 2/- per day for each student.

#### \*GAMES & SPORTS FACILITIES

The College has a playground of its own within the college premises. It also offers facilities of physical exercise to its students through games like Football, Volleyball, Cricket, Kabadi and encourages athletics in the form of Annual Sports Meet. The College is affiliated to the Burdwan University Sports Board, and participates in intercollege competitions. Our Volleyball teams (both boys & girls) have become champions in the University for successive years. Out students excel in athletics, participating in competitions at the university, state and national levels. Some of them have been secured positions in the Khelo-India games.

#### \*UNIFORM FOR PHYSICAL EDUCATION STUDENTS:

#### \*COMMON ROOM

There are two separate Common Rooms for boys and girls. A number of Journals and Newspapers are subscribed for the students which are available in the Common Room on production of Common Rooms Card. Provisions for indoor games, viz Table Tennis, Carom and Chess are also there,

#### \*NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

N.C.C. training is imparted to the girl & boy students of the College. Parades are held in the College Ground on Wednesday under 3rd Bengal Battalion, Serampore, Hooghly, of West Bengal and Sikim Directorate. Various camps such as ATC, CATC, NTC, AATC are organized throughout of the year. Enrolment is made just after the beginning of the 1st year classes, N.C.C, Cadets are eligible for 'B' and 'C' certificate examinations every year conducted by the Directorate at the end of January. NCC Students are required to provide his/her own bank account number at the time of enrollment to 1 st year NCC for getting TA/ WA directly.

#### \*NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The three N.S.S. Units of the College, approved by the University of Burdwan, had started functioning since January 1990. College students, both male and female, may join the scheme as one of the Co-curricular Programmes under the guidance of a Programme officer who is a member of the teaching staff. Regular activities include adoption of a village, road repairing, cleaning the college premises, mass campaign against spread of corona virus, & use of polythene for wearing musk and various other social service as well as general awareness campaigns.

#### \*BIO-DIVERSITY MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The College has a Biodiversity Management Committee which had completed the project on: Preparation of People's Biodiversity Register (PBR) of Tarakeswar Municipality Sanctioned by West Bengal Biodiversity Board; Department of Environment, Government of West Bengal.

#### \*COLLEGE CANTEEN

The College has a good canteen which caters to the need of the students specially those who come from distant rural areas. Good foods prepared under hygienic conditions, are served at reasonable prices.

#### \*MEDICAL AID & REGIONAL STUDENTS' HEALTH HOME

Students can avail consultations with the specialists in 'Student Health Home' to which the College has an institutional membership.

#### \*STUDENTS' AID FUND

Poor and meritorious students are given aid in the form of concession in tuition fees only. Students from the economically weaker sections of the society (Scheduled Castes/Tribes/OBC/Physicaly Handicapped/Minorities) get Govt. of India's stipend through West Bengal Govt, to meet college fees and other expenses. Meritorious students are taken special care of by the State Govt. and the girl students get various stipends from government and different private companies.

#### \*STUDENTS' UNION

The College has a democratically elected students' union. Its election is held as per the Constitution approved by the Governing Body of the College. Teachers and administration of the College constantly interact with the students union; to review and redesign teaching programmes, to introduce new courses, and to ensure discipline in the college campus. The constructive relation between the administration and the students' union is a noble heritage of the college. On its own, the students' union organizes various cultural programmes, sports competitions etc. It also publishes the annual college magazine.

#### \*VEHICLE PARKING SHED

The college has a cycle stand within its premises where students and visitors must keep their bi-cycles, motorcycles etc.

#### \*NOTICE BOARD

The Central Notice Board is located on the ground floor of the college and a Digital Notice Board is displayed in front of the college office Besides, each department has its own notice board which displays relevant information relating to examination schedules, results of classtests, seminars / workshops, extension lectures, change in schedules or in allotment of classrooms, class-routine, wall-magazines, suspension and resumption of classes, departmental academic calendar etc. Therefore, students should keep themselves abreast of such information and look at the notice-board regularly.

The Department of Chemistry conducts add-on course on Santizer and Detergent preparation.






